

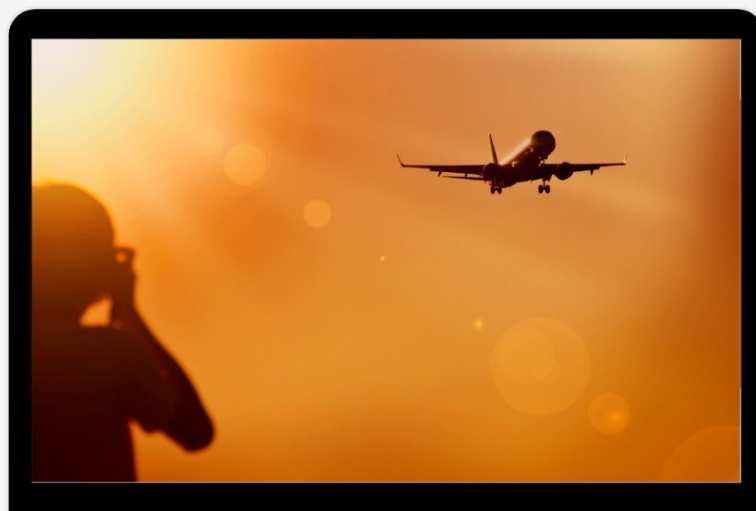

Aviation Databases

If you're serious about logging the aircraft spotting you're doing, using an aviation database is essential. It can provide all of the information of the aircraft you've seen without laborious research and manual tracking (as much as many of us love an Excel spreadsheet).

Most databases have tens or hundreds of thousands of airframes listed, all with type and construction information, dates, current and previous registrations and operators, and details on residents of different airports and airfields. It's an easy and quick way to log your sightings.

Mobile/Tablet Apps

Most of us use smartphones and tablets these days, and there are many apps (applications) available that are specifically targeted towards aviation enthusiasts, or can be used to help in some way.

Some of the suggestions below also operate as websites, and may be listed above; some also may only be available on Apple iOS or Android and not the others.

Flightradar24 – Flight tracking.

Flightaware - Like Flightradar24, Flightaware is a way of tracking flights.

Facebook – With many pages and groups dedicated to plane spotting and aviation news.

Google Maps – An invaluable resource for planning travel and getting around airports.

LiveATC – Listen in to air traffic control at airports all over the world.

Phone Camera – Not strictly an app, but your smartphone's camera is great for taking pictures and videos of aircraft.

StationWX – A detailed weather app detailing current and forecast weather at airports and airfields around the world.

X – Formerly Twitter. Again, many channels to subscribe to for the latest aviation happenings.

Plane Spotting Equipment

To be a plane spotter you don't need any special equipment. A notebook and pen are perhaps the simplest equipment you need, or perhaps just the notepad app on your smartphone.

To take it to the next level, there's a range of equipment you might consider acquiring to help you. These include:

Binoculars or Telescope 'pole'. This helps you to see aircraft at a distance and confirm details, like their registration (tail number), serial or special markings.

Cameras. A good SLR camera with a variety of lenses (aim for a zoom lens of at least 200mm for general photography around airports, plus a standard short lens for close-up shots, museums etc).

Video camcorder. If you want to take videos of aircraft too, then it's good to have a camcorder with zoom functionality.

Smartphone or Tablet to use apps for flight tracking, browsing the web on the go, or even noting down registrations electronically. Most also have a handy camera for good quality close-up shots and videos.

Notebook and Pen. The old school way to note down registrations that you've seen if you're not using a phone.

Airband radio. Many spotters like to listen in to airport radio frequencies to hear aircraft talking to air traffic control. It can be useful for working out when aircraft are on approach, or due to taxi for take-off.

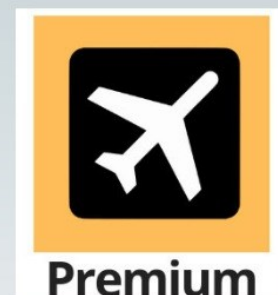
